Release prisoners after they complete jail sentence: SČ

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NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday directed all states to ascertain if any convict was languishing in prisons beyond the fixed term of sentence as it underlined that such prisoners would be entitled to release without seeking any further order for remission.

The order came in a petition filed by Sukhdev Yadav, a convict in the 2002 Nitish Katara murder case, whose life term was converted to a fixed term sentence of 20 years, without any remission, by the top court in October 2016. After the sentence period ended on March 9, Yadav's application for remission was rejected by the Delhi government. He then approached the apex court, which first granted furlough on June 26 and ordered his release


In a detailed judgment giving

reasons for releasing Yadav, a bench of justices BV Nagarathna and KV Viswanathan said, "On completion of 20 years of sentence, it was wholly unnecessary to seek remission as during the period of 20 years, he was not entitled to any remission."

"From March 9, 2025 (when he completed the 20-year sentence), he cannot be kept in jail. His continuous incarceration after March 9 till June 25 (when he was released on furlough) was illegal," the bench held.

Earlier, the Delhi government had objected to Yadav's plea for release, stating that the 20-year sentence was stipulated within the life term as a period within which he was not entitled to remission. After he had undergone this period, the Sentence Review Board (SRB), which considers remission of prisoners, refused him "premature release" on March 28 stating he has "potential to commit crime".

The top court noticed the facts

of the case and felt concerned whether such a legal interpretation was coming in the way of release of other similarly situated convicts. "This court has held that prisoners are languishing behind bars even after being acquitted or on completion of sentence. Let a copy of this judgment be circulated to all home secretaries to ascertain whether any accused/convict has remained in jail beyond the period of sentence and if so, to

issue directions for their release, if not wanted in any other case," the bench ordered.

Underlining the protection of Article 21 of the Constitution that guarantees life and liberty, the bench added: "We hold that in all cases where an accused/convict has completed his period of jail term, he shall be entitled to be released forthwith and not continued in imprisonment if not wanted in any other case."

It further directed the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) to communicate the list of such prisoners to the state and district legal services authority for implementation of the judgment. The bench further clarified

that when a convict is sentenced to life imprisonment with an accompanying condition that such a convict shall not be entitled to remission for a 20-year period, they ought to be released on completion of the said term. However, this will be subject to the condition that other punishments for the accompanying offences run concurrently and the convict is not wanted in any other case.

In such a scenario, the court held that the convict will not be required to apply for remission as the life sentence has been replaced with a sentence of 20 years without remission.

Senior advocate Siddharth Mridul, arguing for the petitioner, submitted that with the October 2016 ruling by the top court, Yadav cannot be allowed to remain in jail beyond completion of the fixed-term sentence. Releasing Yadav on July 29, the court had said: "Once the court has quantified a sentence without remission for 20 years, there is no sentence beyond 20 years.'

The complainant in the case Nilam Katara, the mother of Nitish Katara, had also argued and opposed Yadav's release claiming that the witnesses have been living in fear.

SEC says sought India law ministry's help on summons for Adani

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WASHINGTON: The Securities and Exchange Commission is in touch with India's law ministry to serve billionaire Gautam Adani and his nephew Sagar Adani with legal documents related to a civil suit alleging violations of American securities laws, the US regulator said in a letter filed in a New York City court.

In its status updated dated August 11 to Magistrate Judge James Cho of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York, the SEC said that Indian authorities have not yet served the Adanis, based in India, with the summons yet.

The SEC filed charges in November 2024 against the two businessmen, claiming they had a role in alleged payments to the tune of hundreds of millions of dollars to Indian officials for securing renewable energy contracts.

The US markets regulator

said it filed the charges as a 2021 offering by one of the companies allegedly involved, Adani Green, raised funds from US investors and the shares of another company, Azure Power, was previously traded on the New York Stock Exchange.

The Adani Group has denied the charges, terming them "baseless".

The group did not respond to a request for comment on the SEC's latest filing.

The SEC informed the New York Court that it intends to continue efforts to work with Indian authorities.

SHARING USER **PREFERENCES NOT** PRIVACY BREACH: WHATSAPP

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BENGALURU: Social media platform WhatsApp told the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) on Tuesday that sharing basic account details and generic user preferences with Meta cannot be regarded as a violation of users' right to privacy.

Senior counsel Mukul Rohatgi who appeared for WhatsApp, told NCLAT that the only information WhatsApp which too is owned by Meta, shares with the latter, is "generic, non-content data" inferred from "user interactions" with businesses on the platform, such as an "interest in luxury cars, frequent restaurant engagement, or regular travel."

Rohatgi argued that WhatsApp merely tells Meta how many times a user goes to a restaurant but not what they eat. It tells Meta how many times a counsel argues before the Tribunal, but not the content of their actual arguments, he added.

This user metadata does not include the actual content of messages and therefore cannot amount to a breach of privacy, the senior counsel argued.

"Personal preferences such as who your friends are, where you go, what exactly you eat, constitute privacy. If I (WhatsApp) am only telling (Meta) that those in the age group of 50 to 70 prefer to buy a Mercedes car, that does not constitute any breach of privacy. That is not an offence," Rohatgi said. NCLAT was hearing the appeals filed by WhatsApp and Meta challenging a 2024 order of the Competition Commission of India (CCI) that imposed ₹213.14 crore penalty on Meta for abuse of dominance.

The dispute arises from a January 2021 notification issued by WhatsApp informing users about its revised terms of service and privacy policies. The new policy stated that effective February 8 the same year, users were required to accept all terms, including an expanded scope of data collection as well as mandatory data sharing with Meta companies, to continue using WhatsApp.

The Tribunal will continue hearing the arguments on Wednesday.

Reacting to the development, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) information and technology department in-charge Amit Malviya said Bhat's killing remains one of the most chilling reminders of the atrocities that triggered the mass exodus of

Kashmiri Pandits in 1990. "...Her murder was not just a heinous crime but part of the targeted campaign of ethnic cleansing against Kashmiri Pandits, aimed at driving the Hindu minority out of the Valley," he said in a post on X.

DGCA issues notice to IndiGo over improper pilot training

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NEW DELHI: India's aviation regulator has issued a show-cause notice to IndiGo for using "nonqualified simulators" to train pilots operating to three challenging airports, citing scrutiny of records and email replies from the airline.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation notice, issued on Monday and seen by HT, found that "Category C (Critical) airfield training for flight crew" was conducted using simulators not approved for specific airports as required under Civil Aviation

It found that about 1,700 IndiGo pilots received training on simulators that lacked the

required approval to prepare them for flights to Leh, Kozhikode and Kathmandu. These three destinations are classified as "critical" airports, meaning they present special flying challenges that require specific, certified training equipment.

The review showed several Full Flight Simulators used for training, testing or checking used by the airline were not qualified or approved for those specific destinations. Issues were recorded across 20 simulators nationwide - two each in Delhi, Chennai and Hyderabad, five each in Greater Noida and Gurugram, and four in Bengaluru. All were found unqualified to operate training for the three air-
